Sunday, 25th May 2025 – Sixth Sunday of Easter (C)

Following our Holy Father taking up his official charge on 18th May we pray: O God, who in Your wondrous love watches over your Church, fill the new Holy Father, with love and watchful care, especially for the sick, the poor and the vulnerable to lead us all. We pray that your Holy Spirit will hover over and strengthen him, to be a messenger of love, peace and unity in our world. We offer our prayer through our Lord, lesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen.

Communion Under Both Species: A few parishioners have requested the restoration of Holy Communion under both species, citing the practice now observed in several parishes following the COVID-19 pandemic. After due deliberation, it has been resolved that Holy Communion will be offered under both species, exclusively by means of intinction. Communicants are to receive the sacred host and proceed to the Eucharistic Ministers positioned at the sides, where the host will be dipped into the Precious Blood before being administered. At present, this is deemed the only feasible method for distributing Communion under both kinds. Please refrain from drinking directly from the chalice, as some Eucharistic Ministers have expressed concerns regarding health and hygiene and are therefore unable to purify the chalice afterwards. We will begin the practice commencing with the Vigil Mass at St. Paul's this weekend. St. Paul's Eucharistic Ministers kindly look at the new Rota which is on both Notice Boards and in the Bulletin for your turn to assist in distributing the Holy Communion. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation in this matter.



Prayer for Peace: Let us all pray for peace across our world, that all who are suffering from the conflict of war or oppression may be given the chance to live together in peace and harmony with their neighbours; that all may be able to have access to the basic necessities of life to enable them to live free from oppression and fear. We pray that world leaders across this great world of ours created by God may be able to act to ensure that all of humanity may be given the opportunity to live without the fear of war or conflict and that all may be able to grow in the love of God, our heavenly Father, Amen.



Please Note: This coming Thursday, 29th May, is the Feast of the Ascension of The Lord and is a Holy Day of Obligation. Mass will only be celebrated in St. Paul's at 10:00am to which we invite all parishioners from both of our parishes to come together to celebrate this Feast in the Sacrament of the Eucharist, to give thanks to God for the love He has for all of humanity and to pray for a lasting peace in all areas of our war-torn world of today so that all peoples may be able to live in harmony with each other.

St. John's Graveyard - A reminder that all NEW PLOT burials will almost certainly be a single depth coffin burial. A double burial will only be possible with one coffin and one ashes casket. It is important therefore that couples and families are aware of this restriction. Burials to an EXISTING PLOT may well be double depth, however, a test will be carried out to confirm this prior to the second burial.

Please also note the following - IMPORTANT - It is a requirement of the church that NO CURBS be fitted to the grave with the Memorial Headstone, or at any time after the burial. There is a 300mm. maximum area from the Headstone (grave width) for flower holders etc. There may also be a requirement to have soil spoil temporarily over the plot when a burial is arranged to an adjacent plot.

IMPORTANT - Fr Harriott informed a few Parishioners that they could reserve a burial plot - Unfortunately we are unable to find any record of the permission. If you have been given permission and have any documentation, we would appreciate a copy as available burial plots are decreasing.

Please note, this was not a standard practice.


Hope in a Time of Darkness' – A Lecture by His Eminence Cardinal Timothy Radcliffe OP Monday 23rd June 2025; 7:45pm Galilee Chapel, Durham Cathedral

Durham Cathedral Institute is delighted to be hosting this year's Bishop Dunn Memorial Lecture of the Centre for Catholic Studies at Durham University, hearing from speaker Cardinal Timothy Radcliffe and respondent Prof Anna Rowlands. Cardinal Radcliffe is a distinguished Catholic priest, theologian, and church leader. Between 1992 and 2001, he served as Master of the Order of Preachers (also known as the Dominican Order). Radcliffe received an honorary Doctorate of Divinity from the University of Oxford in 2003; in 2023, he was appointed preacher to the Catholic Church's Synod on Synodality and was made Cardinal by Pope Francis in December 2024.

Anna Rowlands (respondent) is St Hilda Professor of Catholic Social Thought and Practice at Durham University. She is a political theologian whose research interests include the ethics of migration and the tradition of Catholic Social Teaching. In 2023, Rowlands took up a two-year secondment at the Vatican, where she contributed to the global synodal process.
