Parish Community Invitation – Jubilee Year 2025 Reflection Series

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, as we journey together towards the Jubilee Year 2025, we warmly invite all members of our parish community to join us for a series of reflection evenings focused on the Jubilee theme: "Pilgrims of Hope."

Reflection Dates: Thursday, 10th July '25- Thursday, 17th July '25 – and Thursday, 24th July '25 ⌚ Time: 7:00 PM 📍 Venue: St. Paul's Church – Back Chapel.

The Jubilee Year is a sacred time in the life of the Church, celebrated every 25 years, rooted in the Biblical tradition of renewal, reconciliation, and restoration. It is a time of **grace, Pilgrimage, prayer, and communion** with one another and with God. In preparation for this special Holy Year, our reflections will help us deepen our understanding of the Jubilee's spiritual significance and how we can live it out in our daily lives—as individuals, families, and a parish. **We encourage everyone to attend and make these moments of prayer and reflection**, a meaningful part of our journey together. Let us walk as **Pilgrims of Hope** in faith, united in love.



Who is our neighbour?

Although the parable is found only in Luke's gospel, this Sunday's story of the Good Samaritan is among the most widely known gospel passages. So much so that the term "Good Samaritan" has entered everyday English language. Perhaps the very familiarity of the tale, can sometimes stop us realising just how radical it is. The central question "Who is my neighbour?" remains as live today as it was in the time of Jesus. It is a question relevant to conversations about immigration, cuts to international aid and how we treat others, especially those who are different to us. Jesus' choice of a Samaritan – despite the animosity that existed between them and the Jewish people – to illustrate true neighbourly love is striking. It shatters the notion that our neighbour is merely someone nearby, or someone who shares our culture, nation, or faith. Instead, it unequivocally declares that our neighbour is anyone and everyone in need. Reflecting on this parable, Pope Leo XIV asks, "when will we too be capable of interrupting our journey and having compassion?" Let's pray for the grace to be good neighbours to all our sisters and brothers, as we seek to "go and do likewise."

Gentle God, fill us with compassion so we may imitate Your love caring for our neighbours, both near and far, AMEN.

Planned Giving: The most convenient way to donate to the upkeep of both our parishes of St. John's and St. Paul's, is by setting up a Bank Standing Order when joining our schemes.

The alternative option is to use weekly envelopes. Those who use these envelopes they are now ready to be collected from the Piety Stall for the 2025 / 26 Tax Year. **If you are not using the scheme, please do consider joining.** If you are a taxpayer and sign up to Gift Aid this would enable the parish to reclaim the tax you have already paid on your donations thus giving us an additional 25%, **AT NO COST TO YOU.** **If you are a higher rate taxpayer, you can claim back, for yourself, 20% of your donations made to registered charities** when you fill in your **Self Assessment tax return** or by **contacting HM Revenue and Customs (HMRC)** and asking them to amend your tax code.
